- Natheethorn Teacharuangchit of (Thailand) Bradenton, Florida, scored 10 points during the final round for a total of 31 points for the tournament. The double digit round marked his third straight after rounds of 11 and 10 to begin the tournament. This is the first AJGA victory for the 2018 grad who was named to the Transamerica Scholastic Honor Roll in 2016 and 2017.
- Rachel Kuehn of Asheville, North Carolina, carded the most points in the Girls Division during the final round at nine for a total of 20 points. Her best round of the tournament was good enough for a three-point victory. The win is Kuehn's second AJGA victory and her first since 2016. No. 32 in the Rolex AJGA Rankings, she has verbally committed to Wake Forest.
- Austin Coggin of Vestavia Hills, Alabama, tied for the most points with 11 in the final round to elevate himself to second place in the Boys Division. This is the best AJGA finish for Coggin who is verbally committed to Auburn.
- Anne Yu of Shanghai, China, finished in second place in the Girls Division after scoring a total of 17 points for the tournament. This is the best finish for the 2020 grad who is ranked No. 121 in the Rolex AJGA Rankings.

About the AJGA
